# Update: On Track to Restore Georges Pond

The **good news** is that during summer 2019, Georges Pond water clarity was good. The **bad news** is that our algae problem has *not* disappeared. From March through October, we collected water samples that document why.

Algal blooms are associated with high levels (over 15 ppb – parts per billion) of phosphorus (P), a naturally occurring element that has been accumulating forever. When upper water layers of the pond have excessive amounts of phosphorus and receive sunlight, algae thrive. Our data confirm that most phosphorus is released when pond sediment is deprived of oxygen (anoxia).

Conditions for algal blooms are weather dependent. Blooms occur when the anoxia at the bottom of the lake (deep hole) rises to shallower waters (4-6 meters) and/or the high P levels that accumulate over the summer in the deep hole are mixed with upper water layers and exposed to sunlight.

When Georges Pond started to stratify (by temperature and chemically) this June, P levels started to increase in the deep hole (15 meters). This trend continued until October 5 when the P level in the deep hole reached 980 ppb, **the highest phosphorus level ever recorded for Georges Pond**. One week later, the lake completely de-stratified, and all that high P (deep hole) water dispersed throughout the water column. Surface level P levels rose to 35 ppb, the same level documented during our worst algal blooms in 2012 and 2018.

If the lake had de-stratified earlier in the summer, we would have experienced another significant bloom.

### **On Track to Restore Georges Pond. cont.**

In addition to testing for water clarity, temperature, and dissolved oxygen every two weeks, the GPA also gathered phosphorus samples throughout the water column. We mapped the contour of the lake bottom and took samples of bottom sediment, which University of Maine scientists tested to see how the sediment in Georges Pond would react to alum treatments (alum helps bind the sediment P).

In consultation with our science experts, the GPA Board will soon settle on a plan for treating the pond during spring 2020 and also adopt a ten-year Watershed Based Management Plan (WBMP) for guiding our collective efforts over the next decade to minimize adding new phosphorus to the pond.

Bottom line? We're on track to restore Georges Pond to the water quality enjoyed long ago.

### **GPA Awarded 319 Grant**

The GPA has been awarded a 319 grant from the Maine Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to fix NPS (nonpoint source) sites in the watershed that contribute to the buildup of excessive phosphorus in the pond.

This grant **builds on the 2013 watershed survey**, so thanks to everyone who participated in that survey, now benefitting us all.

The \$46,000 grant requires a 40% match in cash and volunteer hours from the GPA and potential partners, including the Town of Franklin and others.

Greg Beane, Environmental Specialist with the DEP's Bureau of Water Quality, said, "I'm looking forward to working with the GPA Board and Hancock County Soil and Water Conservation District on this project. I will be working with the District this fall to develop the project workplan for project startup early next year."

Many thanks to GPA Board member Chuck Dawes, consultant Jennifer Jespersen, and others who submitted this successful grant proposal.

Long-time summer resident and GPA board leader **Richard L. Hall** died August 15 in Towson, Maryland at the age of 96.

A Nebraska native who survived the Great Dust Bowl, Dick was a precocious learner who entered the fourth grade at age 6 and had to delay entering college until his 16th birthday, when he was awarded a full scholarship.
