Alum treatment #1: Done!

The Maine DEP issued the necessary permit

Thanks to the generous financial donations of GPA members and friends of Georges Pond, in mid-May the GPA conducted an initial treatment of the Pond, re-setting the pond's natural balance to a level not seen in decades.

Over the course of four days, an HAB Aquatic Solutions barge glided back and forth over 131 of the Pond's 358 acres, applying a 25 g/m2 dosage of alum and sodium aluminate, the dosage the GPA's water-quality scientists and Maine's Department of Environmental Protection had predetermined as appropriate for re-balancing this lake. Already secchi readings for water clarity have improved.

A second alum treatment of 20 g/m2 will be scheduled as soon as sufficient funds have been raised. These two treatments, in combination with LakeSmart efforts to improve conditions in the watershed, will help prevent algae blooms for **up to twenty years**.



Update on 319 grant

Small subsidies available for residential improvements

The Maine DEP, in conjunction with the US EPA, has awarded the GPA a competitve, **two-year 319 grant** to help make improvements within the Georges Pond watershed. "Although the 319 grant *doesn't* provide funding assistance for the alum treatments of the pond," GPA president John Eliasberg acknowledged recently, "it provides really important support for our efforts **to fix problems in the watershed** that contribute to excessive phosphorus in the pond. The GPA is grateful to receive this coveted award."

(Even though 319 grants -- funded in part by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act -- don't fund in-lake treatments, they support stewardship of watersheds, which is equally important for the restoration and preservation of lakes.)

In 2020, the first year of the grant, property owners wishing to minimize stormwater runoff from going into the lake, can *apply directly to the GPA* for small monetary grants to help offset their costs.

These **matching stipends**, to be distributed on a **"first come**, **first serve" basis**, will be up to \$595, which the property owner needs to match by their own out-of-pocket expenditures and/or sweat equity. (To be reimbursed, an owner needs GPA approval *before* spending any money on their project.) Properties with bigger challenges, such as steep slopes, may qualify for up to \$1,000. **"We hope to assist 15-20 properties by the end of 2021,"** said Eliasberg.

All property owners on Georges Pond are **welcome to apply**, but priority will be given to residential properties with NPS (non-point source) issues.
