
## **GPA Annual Meeting Scheduled for July 9**

The GPA will hold its annual meeting for members and friends at the Franklin town office on **Sunday**, **July 9**, **beginning at 10:00 a.m**. Following a **brief business meeting**, which will include a report on 2022-23 highlights and a budget review, local Maine author **Michelle E. Shores will speak about her recent historical novel**, *The Gathering Room:* A Tale of Nelly Butler.

If you've ever wondered how Butler Point got its name (or Georges Pond, for that matter), Shores will share some wonderful **stories about our community history**. Maine Authors Publishing in Thomaston describes Shores' book this way: "In 1797 Captain George Butler has returned home with his wife Nelly and the beginnings of a family. A successful sea captain turned merchant, George is financially well-off and a pillar of his community. But lurking in the shadows is the young Lydia Blaisdell. She and George have a history, and it's all about to unfold in an epic tale with a supernatural twist." The book, based on a true story, is "a gripping retelling of a piece of Maine history that will keep you engaged from beginning to end."

## The GPA Launches Its Voluntary Septic Inspection Program

As reported in the spring 2023 newsletter, the GPA has launched an exciting new program **to benefit GPA members and to further help protect the pond**: a septic system inspection program

Proper septic system maintenance not only protects property values; it also helps to keep Georges Pond clean. Sadly, it takes only one or two failing septic systems to adversely affect the health of the lake.

As previously announced, the GPA is **offering the following assistance to GPA members** on a strictly voluntary basis:

- The GPA will help schedule and coordinate septic inspections with a licensed professional inspector.
- · Priority will be given to older and high-use systems (year-round and rental properties).
- The GPA will pay 100% of the inspection costs for systems installed before 1974 and 50% of the costs for systems installed between 1974 and 1995.

## **Town of Franklin's Comprehensive Plan**

The Town Selectboard appointed a group of community members in December 2022 to develop an updated comprehensive plan. The plan currently in effect was adopted in 1975. The time has come to update the plan to reflect Franklin's growth since then and forecast our future. Engaging community members in this process will ensure that together we develop a plan that captures Franklin's rich history and a vision for our future.

#### A Comprehensive Plan:

- · Is required by law.
- · Contains information about the Town's resources and economic growth.
- · Provides a framework to address future growth and development.
- Is the basis for Town officials to govern and make planning decisions.

#### Comprehensive Plan Benefits:

- · Provides legal protection for the Town's ordinances.
- · Helps the Town to qualify for State grants and loan programs.
- · Identifies community challenges and solutions.

#### **Next Steps:**

- · The Comprehensive Planning Committee holds monthly meetings open to the public.

### CAMP ROAD IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY

To Minimize Stormwater Runoff that Adds Phosphorus to the Lake, Feeds Algal Blooms

**Thanks to a second grant from the Maine DEP**, funded in part by the United States Environmental Protection Agency under section 319 of the Clean Water Act, the GPA has undertaken **a variety of new projects to protect the Pond's water quality.** 

Phosphorus occurs naturally in Maine soils, and when soil erosion occurs in the Georges Pond watershed, it's typical that phosphorus gets delivered to the lake, providing new sources of food for algae, which then leads to algal blooms.

During the 2023 summer season, **13 residential property owners have signed up for cost-share grants to make improvements to their property**, all designed to reduce stormwater runoff going into the pond.

The GPA has also taken on **some larger-scale erosion control projects on three gravel roads:** Bunkers Beach Road, Cousins Road, and South Shore Colony Road/Clean Sweep Road. See photos below.

In addition, the Town of Franklin will be completing a **major shoreline improvement project at the town beach** on Georges Pond Road. The plan includes installation of a boulder retaining wall to stabilize soils at the shoreline, planting of shade trees and blueberry plants, installation of granite steps with railings, a handicap-friendly area for parking and picnicking, and educational signage.

The total **two-year project** costs is \$140,887 with \$84,265 in grant funding and \$56,622 from local matching contributions (some funding, but mainly volunteer hours of labor), including from the GPA, the Town of Franklin, cost-share grant recipients on private properties, and road associations.
