
Progress Made in 2020, Work Ahead in 2021

Looking Back at 2020, the GPA celebrated a productive year even during an ongoing pandemic.

Thanks to your generosity, we raised the funds necessary to pay for an initial alum treatment of the pond, which was conducted in early May with very positive results. Throughout the summer and fall, water monitoring confirmed that the pond's post-treatment water quality was the best on record since records were first kept in 1977.

Because the pandemic prevented us from holding a large, in-person gathering, the GPA's Annual Meeting was held via Zoom technology, a "first ever" that we managed to pull off, thanks to Jake Eliasberg's savvy tech mentoring. While we missed being together in person, there was an unexpected advantage of gathering online: GPA members and friends as far away as Texas, California, and Washington State were able to join the proceedings. Even if an in-person meeting becomes possible in 2021, we're likely to keep offering a Zoom option to maximize participation.

In addition to the alum treatment, the GPA continued to make progress on other aspects of the GPA's 10-year Watershed-Based Management Plan, especially improving camp roads and working with property owners to minimize stormwater runoff into the pond. (This WBMP plan, approved by the Maine DEP, is posted on the GPA website.)

Progress Made, Work Ahead, cont.

Another remarkable achievement is that, thanks to our superb team of trained volunteers, the GPA completed 27 LakeSmart surveys. LakeSmart is a free, entirely voluntary program, initiated statewide by Maine Lakes, to assist property owners in their efforts, large or small, to protect the pond. Reaching this milestone means that half of all lakeside properties (72 of 144) have now been surveyed.

Looking Ahead at 2021

Because of the strong commitment of GPA members and friends, people have not only paid off their pledges, but also made additional donations to the Fund to Restore Georges Pond, so that we've secured the funds for a second alum treatment, now scheduled for the week of May 10, 2021. Once conducted, that follow-up treatment, as recommended by our science consultants, should maintain the pond's highly improved water quality for two decades or more when combined with runoff-reduction projects in the watershed.

In addition to supporting our 319 residential improvement projects, we anticipate **making more camp road improvements this year**, conducting a bunch of new LakeSmart reviews, and preparing to submit a second 319 grant proposal to the Maine DEP, to help fund further improvements in the Georges Pond watershed.



Tips for protecting Georges Pond

1. Pump out your septic every 3-5 years.

2. Do not bathe, shampoo, or wash boats, pets, or other objects in the lake with soap or phosphorus-containing detergents.

3. Do not use fertilizers near any area that drains to waterbody.

- 4. Keep land clearing and alteration to a minimum.
- 5. Divert runoff from rooftops to rain gardens or divert to a vegetated area.
- 6. Do not burn brush or leaves near the shore.
- 7. Do not allow animals or humans to urinate or defecate into the lake.
- 8. Do not feed ducks or other aquatic life.
- 9. Plant native shrubs and other vegetation to reduce shoreline erosion.
- 10. Use phosphate-free fertilizers.
- 11. Clean up pet waste.
- 12. Do not use powerful boat motors in shallow areas.
- 13. Avoid removing trees along the waterfront.
- 14. Reduce road salt use in sensitive drainage areas.
- 15. Promote wise land stewardship.
